DAD-581 – Professor (tenure track) and UQAC institutional Research Chair in Archean metallogeny (beginning July 1, 2017)

This UQAC position is related to the Canada First Research Excellence Fund (CFREF), Metal Earth Project led by Laurentian University. Metal Earth is the largest ever mineral exploration research project undertaken in Canada (<http://merc.laurentian.ca/metalearth>) Metal Earth seeks to identify and understand the processes responsible for Earth's differential metal endowment during the Precambrian. This research initiative aims to transform our understanding of Earth's early evolution and how we explore for metals.

The Université du Québec à Chicoutimi (UQAC) is a thriving francophone educational and research institution located in the Saguenay-Lac-Saint-Jean area of the Québec province, Canada. Research in Archean metallogeny and mineral exploration conducted by the CERM (Centre d'études sur les ressources minérales) is recognized as Theme of Research Excellence in the UQAC strategic plan. The Earth Sciences Unit includes one Canada Research Chair in magmatic metallogeny, two analytical laboratories « Laboratoire des Matériaux Terrestres » (LabMaTer) and the « Laboratoire de métallogénie expérimentale et quantitative » (LAMEQ) and hosts the CONSOREM, a mineral exploration research consortium.

The selected candidate must contribute to the Metal Earth Project and will conduct research on Archean geology and mineral resources. Extensive experience in conducting field-based research and geological mapping is essential.
